(town), participated in the twenty second annual Richard Davis Foundation for Young Bassists, Inc., bass conference in Madison, Wisconsin on April 3&4.

Richard Davis, Professor of Bass at the UW-Madison, is an internationally acclaimed performing and recording artist who was honored with the National Endowment for the Arts' 2014 Jazz Master Lifetime Achievement Award. Davis created the conference with the goal of educating young musicians to better prepare them for college.

Forty young bass students ages 7 - 18, from 8 different states, participated in master classes and clinics, worked in classical and jazz ensembles, learned famous bass lines from symphonic works, and performed publicly in recitals. The conference ended with a student concert and grand finale featuring the bass orchestra with over 60 basses playing together all on one stage! Special sessions included an exploratory college workshop, master classes of clinicians working with university students, and student & clinician recitals. Everyone took part in a Q&A session with the 13 bass masters from around the country, both professionals in the industry and university professors, who shared their insights as teachers and performers on subjects that included a wide variety of musical styles from classical European music, Jazz, R&B and Brazilian music to Rockabilly and Funk.
